During the session:

- Watch the recorded session and record the key information on the board to allow students to fully engage in the session.

After the session:

- Complete the accompanying 'Post VIC Farmer Time' activities found on the Produce It. Protect It. website.
- Allow students to record any additional questions they have for the farmer, or about food and fibre production and record them on a VIC Farmer Time postcard (see [resources](#) page on the Produce It. Protect It. website) to be sent to the Victorian Education Officers.
